Location: River Tyne between Blaydon & Scotswood

The Boat Club Committee ensures that the club operates generally in a safe way and provides the contextfor the Organising Committee to operate..

The Organising Committee for the event is responsible for the overall planning and coordination of the event and for operations on the day. Actions c an and will be delegated to individuals - a checklist for tasks needing doing will be used. The Race Committee for an event has a very limited remit - essentially it is made up of the umpires on the day of the event, but with the chair appointed well in advance by the regional umpiring committee chairman. The Race Committee deals primarily with umpiring issues, including disqualification etc. However, the chair of the Race Committee will be consulted in advance on overall arrangements and in the immediate run-up on possible cancellation due to weather conditions, etc.

Note: This assessment is based on the current intention of basing event admin & catering purposes at Tyne Amateur Rowing Club, with use of NUBC and TURC facilities.
